

CHAPTER 5, PART 2

Verses 21-43

JESUS TOUCHES THE UNTOUCHABLES

After freeing a demon possessed man from legions of devils, Jesus immediately got into the boat and traveled back to His home in Capernaum to a desperate father whose daughter was dying and to a poor lonely woman who had been sick for a long time. As we have seen thus far in Mark, Jesus touches the untouchables. He reaches out to those outside of acceptable religious norms—tax collectors, demoniacs, diseased, and He shuns religious insiders.

MEMORY VERSE
